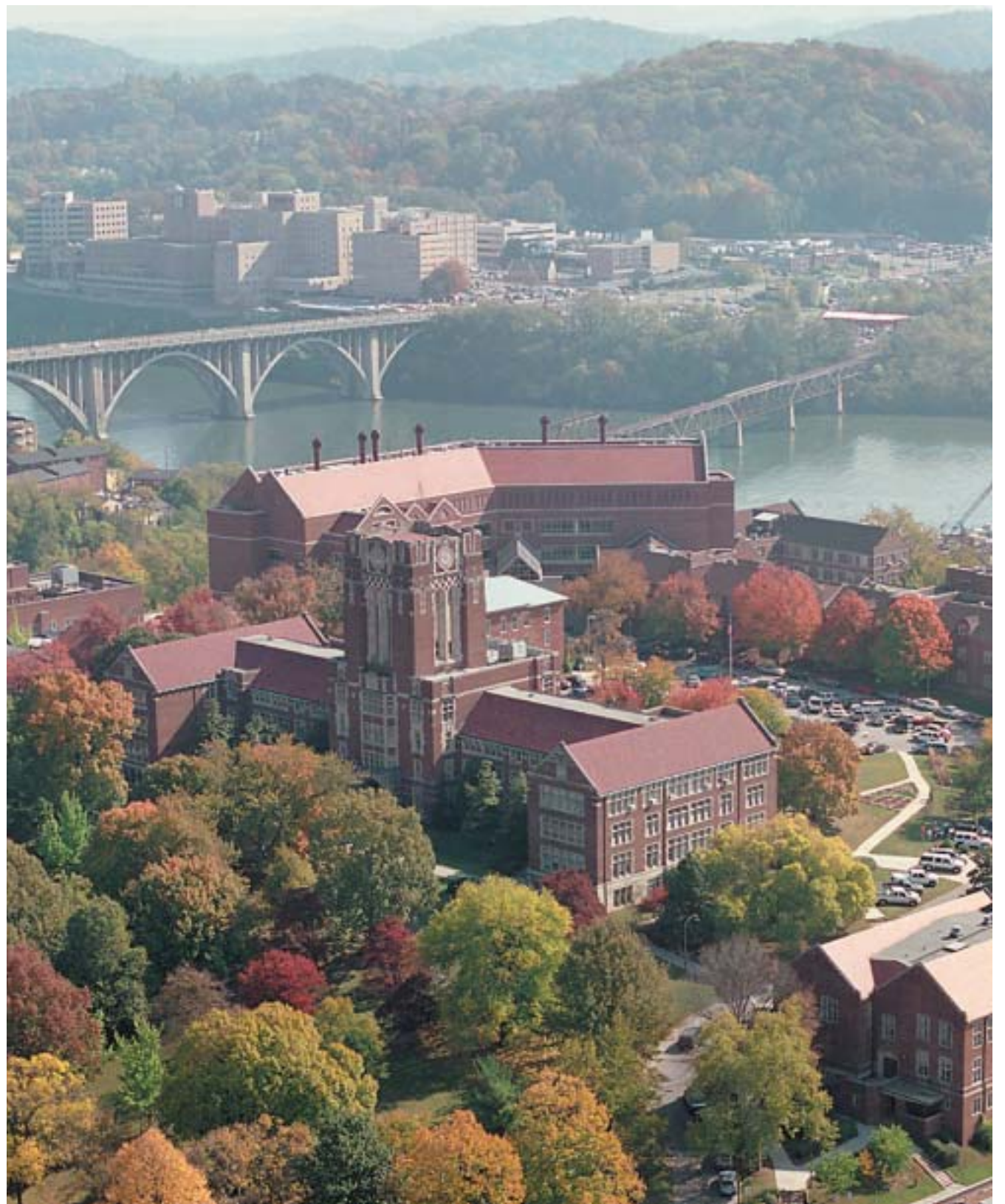
What A Treat... A First-Class Souvenir

American Museum of Science and Energy

The American Museum of Science and Energy offers two levels of interactive exhibits on the World War II Manhattan Project that created Oak Ridge. The museum also offers an introduction to basic science, energy forms and their uses. Live demonstrations. Self-guided tour. Admission charge. Hours are 9:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m., Tuesday-Saturday and 1:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m., Sunday. Closed Monday. Located at 300 South Tulane Ave., Oak Ridge (865-576-3200). Drive time is approximately 40 minutes.

Dollywood and Dolly's Splash Country

Dolly Parton's 118-acre entertainment park offers the best music, shows, attractions, crafts, family fun, rides, special events and Smoky Mountain traditions all brought together in one unique place. Dolly's Splash Country is a 25-acre water adventure park that contains a lazy river float, a 25,000-square-foot wave pool and a turbo twister speed slide. Hours for Dollywood are 10:00 a.m.- 6:00 p.m. Monday, Wednesday-Friday, 9:00 a.m.- 8:00 p.m. Saturday-Sunday. Hours for Dolly's Splash Country are 10:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. Admission charge. Located at 1020 Dollywood Lane, Pigeon Forge (800-DOLLYWOOD). Drive time is 50 minutes.

The Louise Mandrell Theater

This theater is home to a multi-million dollar musical production, starring country music singer Louise Mandrell in every show. Music is featured from the Country, Blues, Cajun, Rock 'n' Roll, Big Band, and Gospel genres. Elaborate sets, spectacular costumes, and extravagant props dazzle crowds and help make this the most attended show in the Smokies. Admission charge. Show times vary (1-800-768-1170) Located at 2046 Parkway, Pigeon Forge, Tennessee. Drive time is approximately 45 minutes.

Smokies Baseball

Sevierville, Tenn., is home to the Tennessee Smokies baseball team, a Double-A affiliate of the St. Louis Cardinals. The team is part of a traditional, year-round minor league professional sports scene that Knoxville-

area fans enjoy. Set appropriately against the backdrop of the Smoky Mountains, Smokies Park offers exciting baseball entertainment, souvenir hunting at The ClubHouse Shop, and enjoyable dining at The Double Play Café. Ticket charge. Game times vary (865-286-2300). Located at 3540 Line Drive, Kodak, Tennessee. Drive time is 30 minutes.

Ripley's Aquarium of the Smokies

Ripley's Aquarium is America's most visited saltwater aquarium. It features the world's longest underwater tunnel, 10-foot sharks and 34 exhibits with over 8,000 exotic sea creatures. Admission charge. Hours are 9:00 a.m. – 9:00 p.m., Sunday-Thursday, and 9:00 a.m. – 11:00 p.m., Friday-Saturday. Located at 88 River Road, Gatlinburg (865-430-8808 or 888-240-1358). Drive time is approximately 1 hour.

The Lost Sea

Take a boat ride on the Lost Sea, America's largest underground lake and registered natural landmark. Guided tours leave every few minutes. Admission charge. Open daily except Christmas. Hours vary. Located at 140 Lost Sea Road, Sweetwater, Exit 60 off I-75 (423-337-6616). Drive time is one hour.

Great Smoky Mountains National Park

The Great Smoky Mountains National Park is the most visited National Park in the U.S. The Park's 520,000 acres encompass over 800 miles of trails for hiking and horseback riding and 735 miles of streams for fishing. The park was named for the smoke-like bluish haze that often surrounds these legendary mountains. No charge for park access. The Great Smoky Mountains are located approximately 40 miles southeast of downtown Knoxville, straddling the border of Tennessee and North Carolina (865-436-1200). Drive time is approximately one hour.

Museum of Appalachia

The Museum of Appalachia is a 65-acre working rural farm village with animals and gardens, 30 original cabins and buildings, the Display Barn, the People's Building and the Hall of Fame, with more than 250,000 items. Admission charge. Hours are 8:00 am-dusk. Located at Exit 122 off I-75 near Norris (865-494-7680). Drive time is 30 minutes.
